Immunization Requirements

In accordance with Washington State Law ALL public/private schools in the State of Washington must have an official Washington State Certificate of Immunization form on file with the school for each child in attendance. All CIS forms must be legible and contain the month, day and year of vaccination and a parent/guardian signature <u>OR</u> a medical, personal or religious exemption form on file (see below).

Immunization Status Forms and Exemptions

New immunization laws were implemented August 2020. All immunization records for incoming new students or updates for current students turned into schools or child care centers are required by state law to be medically verified.

Here are some examples of medically verified immunization records:

- A completed <u>Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS)</u> signed by a health care provider. Find the CIS form by visiting https://www.doh.wa.gov/SCCI and clicking on "Certificate of Immunization Status."
- A CIS filled out by you or another parent/guardian with medical records attached.
- A CIS printed by a health care provider from the Washington State Immunization Information System.

Certificate of Exemption

Washington State Law allows parents or guardians to exempt their child from the school or childcare immunization requirements. Exemptions may be claimed for personal/philosophical, religious or medical reasons. Measles, mumps, and rubella may not be exempted for personal/philosophical reasons. To request an exemption a completed Certificate of Exemption must be submitted to the school or child care center.
