Late Payment Policy

If payment is more than 14 (calendar) days late, you will be charged a late fee of \$ 500. If payment is more than 21 days late, your students F-1 visa status can be revoked.

Insurance

Proof of Illness/Accident Insurance with coverage while in the U.S. is required for all international students yearly. Your student must provide proof of insurance prior to the first day of school each year. Information on insurance can be found online from several companies. You must have a minimum of \$ 100,000 in coverage. Please read the policy carefully. Not all insurance policies cover sports injuries. If you plan on playing sports while attending NCA you will need sports injury coverage. Do **not** send money for the insurance policy to NCA.

Host Family Room and Board - (if applicable)

- \$ 12,000 per year payable in 10 equal installments of \$ 1,200 per month. Host fees include transportation to and from school, food and hygiene supplies as provided for family, and utilities. Stipend does not include long distance phone calls, cell phone or private phone line. Cell phone plans may be purchased separately.
- Please pay your host family directly by the 1st of the month. Do not send this money to NCS.

Spending Money

Please provide your student with a reasonable allowance for extras while they are here so they may participate in school events and activities.

- STANDARD OF CONDUCT: I appreciate and uphold the standards of the school and do not tolerate profanity/obscenity in word or action, dishonor to God and the Word of God, or disrespect to the personnel of the school. I hereby agree to support Northwest Christian Schools Mission Statement, Statement of Faith and all policies and procedures as found in the handbook. I authorize this school to employ discipline, as it deems wise and expedient, for the training of my child. I understand that the school reserves the right to dismiss any child who fails to comply with the established regulations and discipline or whose financial obligation remains unpaid.
- **TERMINATION:** The school has the right to suspend or terminate the attendance of any student for reasons set forth in the Parent and Student Handbook (or other published documents), for reasons that the school administration considers detrimental to the student, other students of the school or school community, or for the parent's failure to pay all or any part of the parent's financial obligations for student's attendance (including any amounts charged on student's account with the school).

- **FORCE MAJEURE:** The school's duties and obligations under this contract shall be suspended immediately, without notice, during all periods that the school is closed because of force majeure events including, but not limited to, any fire, act of God, hurricane, war, governmental action, act of terrorism, epidemic, pandemic, or any other event beyond the school's control. If such an event occurs, the school's duties and obligations in this contract will be postponed until such time as the school, in its sole discretion, may safely reopen. In the event that the school cannot reopen, due to an event under this clause, the school is under no obligation to refund any portion of the tuition paid.
- PARENT'S COMMITMENT TO TRUTHFULNESS IN THE ADMISSIONS AND ENROLLMENT PROCESS: The school is relying on the completeness and truthfulness of the information provided by the parent in the admissions and enrollment process. If the school determines, after the student has been admitted and enrolled, that the parent was not truthful in the admissions and enrollment process on any issue that the school, in its sole discretion, finds to be important, the school has the absolute right to terminate this contract. There will be no refund of tuition where such termination occurs and any unpaid balance is payable in full according to the terms of this contract.
- PARENT'S COMMITMENT TO COOPERATION: Parents and family members agree to a positive
 constructive relationship with each other and the school when dealing with school matters, on and off
 campus and in school and at school events. It is the responsibility of the parents to inform and provide
 copies to the school of any court orders and updated custodial or parenting plans.
- REIMBURSEMENT FOR DOMESTIC LEGAL ISSUES: Parents understand and agree that the school's primary purpose is to provide educational opportunities to the students within its institution. Parents also understand that it is disruptive to the school for a parent to involve the school (or any of its employees) in domestic legal disputes between the parents and that the school often must pay for legal fees and costs associated with such issues. Therefore, the parent agrees to promptly reimburse the school for all expenditures incurred by the school as a result of the parent's domestic legal disputes, including, but not limited to: Parental disagreements about student's education or placement; divorce proceedings; custody proceedings; and/or modifications of custody proceedings. NCS TECHNOLOGY POLICY

Every student (and parent who desires their child to have access to school technology) must comply with the following rules of access:

- The school has the right and ability to recall all sites accessed by the students;

 - Attempt to bypass any site-blocking hardware or software, including, but not limited to VPN servers and extensions
 - Access anything contrary to the Statement of Faith, Mission, Vision, and/or Core Values of Northwest Christian Schools, (including but not limited to anything: sexually inappropriate or suggestive in nature, blatantly offensive, ungodly material, lewd or obscene language)
 - Send and/or receive messages to/from other internet sites without teacher supervision and/or authorization
 - Use another person's password
 - o Trespass into another person's folders, files, or digital profile
 - Violate copyright laws;
 - Buy or sell anything via the internet;
 - o Change any of the computers' set-ups or settings.

NCS Electronic Media

NCS continues to explore the ways in which online communication and collaboration through electronic media can empower teachers, students, parents, and staff. NCS understands the importance of these interactions to provide updated communication and share campus highlights.

- Be respectful Always treat others in a respectful, positive, and considerate manner and do not disparage the school or school community members through social media.
- Be confidential Do not publish, post, or release information that is considered confidential or private.

 Online "conversations" are never private. Do not use social media to address any concerns or frustrations.

- Respect private and personal information Never share or transmit personal information of students, parents, faculty, staff, or colleagues online.
- Post images with care Respect brand, trademark, copyright information and/or images of the school and do not post photos of students who are on the "Do Not Photo" list.

Students and Parent/Guardians Acknowledge That:

The school's internet filter is in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA). The filter applies to any device that is connected to the school's wireless connection, whether it is a school-issued Chromebook or a personal laptop. However, the school has no way of filtering student's personal cell phone or devices that have internet or personal "hot spots" that are separate from the school's Wi-Fi.

Students Are Prohibited From:

- Using personal "hotspots" outside the school's network.
- Bringing a cell phone on premises that infects the network with anything designed to damage, alter, destroy, or provide access to unauthorized data or information.
- Processing or accessing information on school property related to "hacking," altering, or bypassing network security policies.

Lost, Stolen, Or Damaged Devices:

Each user is responsible for his/her own cell phone and should use it responsibly and appropriately. NCS takes no responsibility for stolen, lost, or damaged cell phones, including lost or corrupted data on those devices. While school employees will help students identify how to keep personal devices secure, students will have the final responsibility for securing their cell phones.

Usage Charges:

NCS is not responsible for any possible device charges (i.e. apps a student downloads during class) to your account that might be incurred during approved school-related use.

Network Considerations:

Users should strive to maintain appropriate bandwidth for school-related work and communications. NCS does not guarantee connectivity or the quality of the connection with personal devices. NCS is not responsible for maintaining or troubleshooting students' personal electronic devices.

During the course of the school year, additional rules regarding the use of personal devices may be added or modified.
